Voter Registration forms are available at the Post Office, your local library or by visiting [www.votespa.com](http://www.votespa.com) or calling 1-877-VOTESPA. Forms must be mailed in before April 19th.
2. **Encouraging** your colleagues, families and friends to register and vote.

4. **Voting** Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
