

Voter Resource Guide

To vote on election day, here is what you need to know:

1. Find your polling place

Visit www.votespa.com, the Pennsylvania Department of State's online voting information and resource center, and enter your address to find your polling location. You can also call 1-877-VOTESPA (877-868-3772)

2. Polls are open from 7:00 AM – 8:00 PM on November 2nd.

3. Bring identification

All voters must show proof of identification. Approved forms of photo identification include:

- Pennsylvania driver's license or PennDOT ID card
- ID issued by any Commonwealth agency
- ID issued by the U.S. Government
- U.S. passport
- U.S. Armed Forces ID
- Student ID
- Employee ID

4. Know who you are voting for

Information about the 2010 Legislative and Gubernatorial races and candidates can be found at **Project Vote Smart** (www.votesmart.org) which provides information on your candidates by district. Enter your 9 digit zip code, click on "Current Candidates", scroll down, and click on individual names for contact information.

5. Absentee ballots

The last day to apply for a civilian absentee ballot is October 26. Absentee ballots must be received by the County Board of Elections by October 29. For more information, go to www.seventy.org/elections.
